CEO Report

Choose your battles

As I'm preparing for my presentation at next week's ASPECT Conference, I'm going through the copious amounts of notes taken during my provincial tour. A common phrase emerges from many of these meetings: "you've got to choose your battles." It's a phrase I've heard over and over; most of the time it pertains to the "battleground" where policy meets practice.



The push-pull or battleground is between interpreting the specifics of a policy's wording versus the overall intention of a policy. As a result, many of our members spend an inordinate amount of time interpreting policy, taking them away from the clients they are there to help. ASPECT's job is to find ways to narrow the gaps between policy and practice. We do this by informing and educating government about what's needed and by soliciting our members for information about their challenges and concerns.

One of the ideas I've been floating with our members and our funders is a program fashioned after the "take your daughter to work" days, except that we would coordinate an opportunity to have a "take your policymaker to work" day. Through a day of job shadowing, those making the policy would have a chance to see their policies in action on the frontlines and those implementing the policy, would have a chance to understand the complexities of creating new and adjusting existing policy.

It's not a new idea; we were recently reminded of its effectiveness in an article from the <u>Brandon Sun</u> reporting on a "take your MLA to work" program in Manitoba.

Almost all members I've talked to about this idea are completely on board and would welcome a ministry worker to job shadow for the day to see how people don't always fit into what's outlined in the policy. The intended outcome of this experiment is to inform and educate, but it can also create stronger personal relationships between those who make policy and those who deliver programs within it. It's an opportunity to move away from the battleground and instead be together at the table.

We all want to be successful whether creating the policy or putting it into practice. As always, I welcome your feedback and ideas.
